As you move into this new opportunity for learning, you may have questions or concerns regarding your child's readiness for school. To help answer those questions, (and ease your mind), we've asked highly regarded early childhood teachers from around our district to share their insights on helping your child gain the right mix of kindergarten-readiness skills.

The skill sets they are looking for might surprise you. Because of the national focus on improving education and meeting standards, you might think that it's most important for children to enter kindergarten knowing their ABCs, numbers, shapes, and colors so they can keep up with the curriculum. While teachers would love children to come in with letter and number recognition, they don't want you to drill your kids on academic skills. There are equally — if not more — important readiness skills that set the stage for your child's learning. Raising an eager learner is the goal, and it can be achieved easily through play and day-to-day activities.

To help your child have a successful kindergarten experience, we suggest you work on the following readiness skills with your future kindergartener: enthusiasm toward learning, solid oral-language skills, the ability to listen, the desire to be independent, the ability to play well with others, strong fine-motor skills, and basic letter/number recognition. Your child is unique, and we want to ensure that this most important first step lays the foundation for a very successful school experience. These readiness skills will help your child succeed in kindergarten as well as pave the way for an outstanding educational career.



KINDERGARTEN OPTIONS

Warren Consolidated Schools provides two options to meet your child's educational needs. Students eligible for kindergarten must be five years old on or before September 1st of the year they begin school.

KINDERGARTEN

Kindergarten is a full day program. You may anticipate a year of great wonder, enthusiasm, and engagement as your child enjoys a wide variety of learning experiences. Literacy skills are the primary focus. A comprehensive, integrated curriculum that includes basic math concepts, STEM experiences, art, media, music, and physical education.

TRANSITIONAL KINDERGARTEN (TK)

Transitional Kindergarten (TK) is intended to meet the needs of children who are not quite developmentally ready for the traditional kindergarten classroom. Children who will turn 5 years old between September 1 and December 1 and children who have little or no preschool experience may need TK to be more prepared for kindergarten the following school year. This full day program combines academics with critical social and emotional development, oral language, early literacy, and mathematical skills.

LATCHKEY PROGRAM

Warren Consolidated Schools is proud to offer our community a high-quality Latchkey program available before and after school for students in grades TK-5 who are registered in one of our twelve (12) elementary schools.

Latchkey programs provide supervised care on a regular basis for children during hours of the day when school is not in session; and parents are not available.

READY FOR SCHOOL?

The following points should be considered as your child prepares to begin his/her school experience. A child should:


- Know their first and last name and be willing to give it when asked.
- Know their address and telephone number.
- Know their parents' first and last names (especially important if last names are different than the child's).
- Be able to dress and care for them self.
- Be able to follow simple directions.
- Be able to print their first name so it can be recognized.
- Be able to recognize their own printed name.
- Be able to speak in a voice loud enough so people can hear them when in front of a group.
- Be able to manage their emotions (anger, sadness, etc.).
- Be able to take responsibility for their own actions.
- Be able to listen quietly while others are talking.
- Be able to share, take turns, and play cooperatively with others.
- Be able to recognize and extend patterns.
- Be able to count 10-20 objects.
- Be able to recognize 40 letters either upper or lowercase.
- Be able to listen to a story and answer simple questions about it.
- Be able to use crayons, paste, and scissors and know what to do and what not to do with them.
- Be able to put together a simple puzzle.
- Be able to bounce and catch a ball.
- Be able to stand on one foot for five or more seconds.
- Show a desire to experiment and make things with materials such as paints, clay, and paper.
- Participate willingly in new experiences.

PREPARING FOR SCHOOL

Kindergarten is a big milestone for your child-and you! It can be scary and stressful for your child, especially if this is your child's first experience in school. However, if you take some steps to prepare your child for this new experience, you can ease some of the anxiety and get your child's schooling off to a great start.

Tell your child what to expect. Your child needs to know about the teacher, the principal, and others who want to help. Talk with your child about what to expect during a typical school day, including classroom time, lunch and snacks, recess and bathroom breaks. The more your child knows about the details, the less anxious he/she will feel about the first days of school.

Rehearse for the big day.

Do a test-run of the new routine:

- Wake up at the time necessary in order to give your child plenty of time to get ready.
- Plan and fix a healthy breakfast.
- Lay out clothes the night before and make sure zippers, buttons and ties are able to be easily fastened.
- If your child takes a school bus, walk to the bus stop and talk about boarding the bus and where to sit. If you will drive them to school, talk about landmarks along the way and pick-up and drop-off areas.
- If you will be sending a lunch, make sure it is nutritious food that they like and can open. Juice boxes, fruit cups and zip lock bags can frustrate your child if they haven't had practice. Remind them to ask for help if needed. Lunch staff will be there to help.
- Go over the after-school routine, latchkey and evening schedule.
- Make sure your child knows your full name, address, and where you work.

Show an interest in what your child does. Remember that learning is fun! The things your child does at school are important. Your child wants you to show an interest in them, too.

Getting and staying involved in your child's school. Visit the school website and social media sites to stay up-to-date on important dates and activities happening at the school. Speak with your child's teacher regularly, and if possible, participate in your school's booster organization.



ENROLLMENT INFORMATION

In order to begin kindergarten, a **child must be five years old on or before September 1st of the year he/she is entering school** OR if with a waiver, your **child turns 5 years old on or before December 1st.**

WHAT IS PRE-REGISTRATION ENROLLMENT?

- The Pre-Registration is a public form used for families who wish to enroll in WCS.
- It is the 1st step in enrolling in WCS. This collects basic demographic information for families enrolling in WCS.

Step 2-Receive Confirmation Email

You will receive a Welcome to Enrollment Express email from enrollment@accelaschool.com, that your Pre-Registration was received. Your child's Pre-Registration will be reviewed by District staff. You will receive more information when it is processed, this could take up to 30 minutes. Step 3-Parent Account Set-Up (FIRST TIME PARENT PORTAL USERS ONLY)

You will receive an additional email on how to create your PowerSchool Parent Portal Account using the provided Access ID and Access Password.

- Identification - Michigan driver's license, Michigan ID or passport of the parent or legal guardian.
- Residency - Property tax statement, monthly mortgage statement, lease, or closing papers **AND** a current utility bill.
- Immunization records.
- Vision and Hearing Screening.
- Special Education Students ONLY-most recent IEP and/or a 504 Plan.

Early Childhood Programs in WCS

- Focus on Kindergarten preparation.
- Focus on Early Childhood objectives for development and learning including: social-emotional, physical health, language, cognitive, literacy, mathematics, science and technology, social studies, the arts, and English Language Acquisition.
- Experienced and dedicated teaching staff who are committed to fostering a love of learning and provide a positive introduction to the school setting.

World of Fours

- Must meet income eligibility guidelines and be a Macomb County resident to qualify.
- Half day and full day programs available.
- Must be 4 years old on or before September 1.
- Applications will be on-line in the spring.

Early Childhood Special Education

- Special Education preschool program for children ages 3-6 with a current IEP
- Offers half-day programs and one full day program
- Classes taught by a certified special education teacher with one paraprofessional per classroom
- Skills taught include: communication, behavior training, fine motor, gross motor, and preschool academics individualized to the student

Transitional Kindergarten

- FREE full-day program.
- Five days per week.
- For students who are born between September 1 and December 1, who would benefit from an additional year of growth between preschool and kindergarten, or who have limited early childhood experiences.
- A program that combines academics with critical social and emotional development standards for students not quite ready for traditional kindergarten.

Tuition-Based Preschool

- 30 week program.
- For students who will be 3 years of age on or before September 1; Class meets 2 days per week for 2 hours.
- For students who will be 4 years of age on or before September 1; Class meets 4 days per week for 3 hours.


