Welcome Back! I hope you are enjoying your summer. We have been very busy the past several weeks with students in our summer programs, and we look forward to the return of in-person learning this fall.

Our first day of school is **Tuesday, August 31, 2021**, with a half-day in the morning for all students. Below is important information to help you prepare for the year:

- ✓ Masks will be optional for ALL students, staff, and visitors both indoors, outdoors, and on our school buses. I encourage you to review with your child whether or not you want them to wear a mask. WCS will continue to supply masks and hand sanitizer in our schools and on our buses, especially since it is strongly recommended that masks be worn indoors.
- ✓ Although masks will be optional, we are still required to quarantine those who are exposed to or test positive for the COVID-19 virus. The length and duration of a quarantine will depend on a person's vaccination status and the timing and onset of symptoms. If you have any questions regarding COVID-19 or anything health related, please email wcshealth@wcskids.net.
- ✓ To support our community, tomorrow, Wednesday, August 11, 2021, from 12:00pm-2:00pm, the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine will be available at Cousino High School for ALL eligible students 12 years or older, parents, and staff. You must pre-register for the vaccine at wcskids.net.
- ✓ Athletics will follow guidance for COVID-19 related issues from the Michigan High School Athletic Association (MHSAA).
- ✓ If you have not done so and would like to request a laptop for your child, please visit www.wcskids.net and fill out the Technology Request Survey. After completing the survey, a laptop will be configured, and you will be notified when it is ready for pickup. Laptops assigned to individual students are expected to be used both at home and in the classroom. If you need assistance with technology, the WCS helpdesk can be reached by calling (586) 782-6999.





- ✓ All breakfasts and lunches will be free for ALL WCS students this year.
- ✓ As schools re-open, we are hiring for various positions throughout the district including bus drivers, nutrition services, custodial, and latch-key positions. Please visit wcskids.net for more information.

## **CDC COVID-19 PREVENTION STRATEGIES**

The key strategies recommended by the CDC to keep schools safer are listed in order of effectiveness:

1. **Promoting Vaccination** against COVID-19 for eligible staff and students. Vaccination has proven incredibly effective as the leading public health prevention strategy. Promoting vaccination can help schools more safely maintain in-person learning as well as extracurricular activities and sports.

### 2. Consistent and Correct Mask Use

- a) CDC recommends universal indoor masking for all teachers, staff, students, and visitors to schools, regardless of vaccination status. This prevention strategy is crucial to allowing students to maintain in-person learning.
- b) CDC has recommendations for <u>proper use of masks</u>.
- c) <u>CDC's order requires</u> all persons regardless of vaccination status wear masks on public transportation, including school buses.
- 3. **Physical Distancing** CDC recommends schools maintain at least 3 feet of physical distance between students within classrooms, combined with indoor mask wearing by students, teachers, and staff, regardless of vaccination status. Because of the importance of in-person learning, schools should not exclude students from in-person learning to keep a minimum distance requirement. When it is not possible to maintain a 3 foot physical distance, it is especially important to layer multiple other prevention strategies, such as indoor masking, screening testing, cohorting, and improved ventilation, etc. to help reduce transmission risk.
- 4. **Screening Testing** identifies infected people, including those without symptoms who may be contagious, so that measures can be taken to prevent further transmission or outbreaks.

### 5. Ventilation

- a) <u>Improving ventilation</u> by opening multiple doors and windows, using child-safe fans to increase the effectiveness of open windows, and making changes to the HVAC or air filtration systems.
- b) Avoiding crowded and/or poorly ventilated indoor activities (e.g., engaging in outdoor activities when possible).
- c) Open or crack windows in buses and other forms of transportation to improve air circulation, if doing so does not pose a safety risk.
- 6. *Handwashing and Respiratory Etiquette:* Promoting <u>handwashing and covering coughs and</u> sneezes.

## 7. Staying Home When Sick and Getting Tested

- a) Encouraging students and staff to stay home if sick or having COVID-19 symptoms.
- b) Encouraging students and staff, regardless of vaccination status, to get tested for COVID-19 if having <u>symptoms</u> or if they are a close contact of someone who has COVID-19.
- 8. **Contact Tracing**, **in Combination with Quarantine**, collaborating with the local health department.



9. **Cleaning and Disinfection:** cleaning once a day is usually enough to sufficiently remove potential virus that may be on surfaces. Disinfecting (using disinfectants on the <u>U.S. Environmental Protection Agency COVID-19</u>) removes any remaining germs on surfaces, which further reduces any risk of spreading infection. CDC has information on routine <u>cleaning</u> to help maintain healthy facilities.

### **HOW TO ASSESS RISK**

Together with local public health officials, school administrators should consider multiple factors when they make decisions about implementing layered prevention strategies against COVID-19. Since schools typically serve their surrounding communities, decisions can be based on the school population, families and students served, as well as their communities. Robust layering strategies will consider the following primary factors:

- Level of community transmission of COVID-19.
- <u>COVID-19 vaccination coverage</u> in the community and among students, teachers, and staff.
- Use of a frequent SARS-CoV-2 screening testing program for students, teachers, and staff who are not fully vaccinated. Testing provides an important layer of prevention, particularly in areas with substantial to high community transmission levels.
- COVID-19 outbreaks or increasing trends in the school or surrounding community.
- Ages of children served in the school and risk associated with school, extracurricular, and social activities.

COVID-19 prevention strategies remain critical to protect students, teachers, and staff who are not fully vaccinated, especially in areas of moderate-to-high community transmission levels. The CDC recommends using *more* strategies when transmission is *higher*, especially if <u>vaccination rates</u> are low. Prevention strategies can allow in-person learning to be maintained, even during high levels of transmission in the surrounding community. The most current transmission levels for each county in the United States is available in the <u>CDC COVID Data Tracker</u> (as is the percent of the population that is fully vaccinated).

Local health departments will work with schools for additional guidance on prevention strategies if there is an <u>outbreak</u> in a facility. Some communities may have additional public health requirements as directed by the local health department.
